Dear Parent/Guardian of students sitting January exams,

Your child is sitting important exams in January that will be counted towards their overall grade. Their exam timetable has been sent to their college email address, along with their seat number.

We understand that there may be uncertainty about the Covid situation and please rest assured that if there are any change in guidance we will communicate with you and students as fast as we can. If there is no communication from us, nothing has changed and the exams will go ahead as normal. Any student who chooses not to attend without good reason will disadvantage themselves and will incur a charge for any additional entries needed as a result.

You may have seen recent news reports about adaptations to GCSE and A level examinations, including the release of advance information before the exams. This does not apply for BTEC qualifications as this guidance only covers A level and GCSE exams only. Students have been told this, and they have been told that they may have adaptations made to their coursework units based on what their teachers have decided.

As this is the first external exam series that they have been able to sit, we want to make sure that they understand the rules and requirements of the exams so that there are no problems on the day. Students have all had rules sent to them, as well as information from the Exams Officer. It's extremely important that all students follow the rules as failure to do so can result in disqualification. We strongly encourage all students to set off to college in plenty of time on their examination days, as public transport running late or traffic is not usually able to be compensated for. Please speak to your child about how they intend to get to college on the day of exams. A student who is late will not get the full time for their exam and may even be barred from taking the exam

All students are being given the guidance below. Please read over these rules carefully, especially about what to do if your child is showing symptoms of Covid-19. It would be greatly appreciated if you can spend some time in advance of the exams to make sure your child understands the requirements.

Important rules for 2021-22 examinations. Covid guidance correct as of 16/12/21 but this may change. Please read government guidance for updates.

All exams are being held in the sports hall. This is at the end of the street on the left.

Morning exams start promptly at 9am and students must arrive at college at 08.30am in order to be able to store their belongings in the secure area and be seated ready for the exams to start.

Students should enter college through the student entrance (turnstiles) as normal.

If you are too ill to attend, or unavoidably late, then you must ring college on 0161 231 9200 as soon as possible. Reception will be open from 8am when we have a morning examination.

Personal belongings including coats, bags, mobile phones and watches are not allowed in the exam room under any circumstances. If you take any of these items into the exam room it may lead to disqualification. If you do bring any of these items with you to college they will be stored securely in a locked room prior to entering the exam room. We will of course do our best to take care of your things but the college accepts no liability for loss or damage.

Please ensure you know your seat number. This can be found on your timetable and seating plans are displayed on the exam notice board adjacent to the sports hall. You must check the plan before entering the sports hall and sit in the place allocated to you. If you sit in the wrong seat you may end up sitting the wrong exam.

Please ensure you bring all the equipment you may need to complete the exam. If you have a pencil case it must be completely see-through. You must complete your exam with a black ballpoint pen, no other colour is allowed.

Food and drink is not allowed in the exam room. You may take in bottled water but only in a clear bottle with any label removed.

You must have your college ID (lanyard) with you. You will not be allowed in the exam room without it. If you do not have it you must see Sharon on reception to obtain a replacement at



a cost of £5. You will need to attend college earlier than 8.30am for this to be processed in time for the start of the exam.

You must attend at the sports hall at least 15 minutes before the start of the exam. If you are late the exam will start without you and the exam board may refuse to accept the work that you do.

Once you have entered the exam room you must not communicate with any other students in any way.

If you need to speak to an invigilator during the course of an exam, raise your hand.

Any student with symptoms of Covid-19 on an exam day must not come to college but must telephone for guidance.

Where a member of your household is symptomatic, you may attend college as long as you don't have Covid-19 symptoms and if a member of your household has tested positive you may attend college as long as you don't have any symptoms and have not tested positive. Please follow latest guidance on Lateral Flow tests and ring us for advise if you need it.

If you feel unwell during an examination let an invigilator know immediately. Under no circumstances can we deal with any issues that are brought to our attention at the end of your exams.

All students must follow all the examination rules and instructions. Students that do not may not be allowed to sit the exam. These can be found on the college website.

Students are expected to return to lessons after their exams.
